



Tom Murphy (1935 - 2018) was born in Tuam, Co. Galway. His first full-length play, under its original title *The Iron Men*, won a number of Irish national playwrighting awards. In 1961 it was produced as *A Whistle in the Dark* at the Theatre Royal, Stratford East, London, one of the most momentous premieres in British Theatre in the 1960s. This production later transferred to the West End.

Tom Murphy's relationship with the Abbey Theatre spanned five decades. In 2001, the Abbey Theatre celebrated its long collaboration with Tom, presenting a special Tom Murphy season of 6 of his plays, with 2018 marking the 50th anniversary of his first production at the theatre — the seminal work, *Famine*, presented on the Peacock stage in 1968. Tom's deft ability to convey emotions of human interaction on stage has captured Abbey audiences from his first premiere to the present. In total the Abbey and Peacock stages saw 19 world premieres of Tom Murphy's original works and adaptations.

Murphy's *The Gigli Concert, Bailegangaire, The House* and *Alice Trilogy* all won Best Play at the Irish Theatre Awards. Other awards include the inaugural Irish Times/ESB Lifetime Achievement Award and the Irish Academy of letters Award. He held honorary doctorates from Trinity College Dublin and NUI Galway. In 2013, he was awarded the Ulysses Medal, the highest honour University College Dublin bestows.

In 2017, President Michael D. Higgins presented Tom Murphy with the gold torc and the title of Saoi, Aosdána's highest honour.

After Tom Murphy's A Whistle in the Dark

Run a bog-scape of footed turf, ditches green & full, to a city where you sit in a café & drink tea till the rain eases. Bedsits & brick yards, bars for dreaming it different, as nights roll into a life & the past stretches. What

sound does bog make when the young are gone? Or the reverberation of brothers fighting in a town full of threat? How does a fist sound as it curbs a tongue? Or a mother's voice in song moments before you left? Because

after you left (& you all left), did anyone whistle? Now that we've been leaving for centuries, what sound has our leaving made? Here goes: there will be pain (derived from speech off-kilter, language a jitter). There will be

echoes, the past holds unhurried (unhinged) voices, loudest from the grave. You try to be yourself with poor precision: so now you're quick to temper & speak in story without revealing. You pummel shame to silence & this

bubbling feeling in your fists — this makes them dance. Your face now in the gutter, oh how indestructible you once were: an iron bridge, new railway lines, the park gates where you drank. But everything faded fast, right, & who was it said: speak well of us over beyond & whatever ye do, let ye mind yourselves.
