02 Workshops

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Presenting with Impact

Using skills from the stage of Ireland's National Theatre, our Presenting with Impact workshop will add impact and energy to your presentation style. With a focus on delivery, participants will learn a series of practical exercises, which will transform how they communicate and present in the workplace.

This full day workshop combines work on the fundamentals of voice, breath and body and moves on to text. We will look at new ways to land your points and engage the attention of your clients, team or board. Participants will be shown how using a greater variety of pitch, pace, tone, and pauses will help them to hold the room, engage and influence clients and colleagues,

and to land their message with greater confidence and ease.

Presenting with Impact is our most sought after workshop, highly practical, its' learnings can be applied to everyday situations and events.

Participants are asked to bring along one of their own work presentations, which they will be coached through, to incorporate the skills above. Individual attention allows each participant to focus on their own specific learning needs.

The Power of Storytelling

Storytelling for Business explores the fundamental skills of communication and develops an understanding of how we can apply this essential human characteristic in a corporate setting.

From pitching to customers to building a brand, creating a culture of shared purpose, by crafting and communicating stories, that influence and inspire, is a vital skill. This workshop explores how good stories work, how to tell them and what it is that draws us in. Participants will learn skills to create stories, which will help captivate and influence your colleagues/clients.

Discover how you can use creativity to engage your audiences, no matter what the subject matter. Learn how using your own stories can reinforce existing strengths and individual styles. Connect presentations with personal values to deepen your connection with listeners.

Participants will explore the structures that shape a compelling narrative. Storytelling techniques from theatre will give participants the skills to create and communicate with confidence and impact. Improvised scenarios based on these will have your teams on their feet and able to apply these learnings.

Using exercises and insights from actor training over the centuries, we will explore how to take more control over how you present yourself and how you interact with others.

Discover how you can increase your awareness in how you relate to space, how consciously you move and how you engage with other people. Negotiate interactions with more sensitivity by exploring the role of status in the workplace. Find more confidence in navigating the professional world through a deeper understanding of the unseen communication that is always present.

Using the structure and tone of great theatrical speeches as a jumping off point, this workshop will offer practical tips that will make the process of writing a speech for a special occasion one that will get to the heart of what you want to say. Whether intending to motivate, to challenge, to inform or to unify, carefully pitched content empowers us to communicate with our audience in a deeper way.

This half-day workshop will give participants the chance to find their own unique, writer's voice, experiment with different narrative structures, and explore a variety of tones and styles to make their speeches pitch-perfect. In the end, each participant will be armed with the tools to write a speech that suits the occasion and that conveys their intentions with warmth, humour and humanity. The workshop combines group work with individual coaching and feedback.

- Anyone tasked with writing a speech to be delivered for a group at a special occasion, including but not limited to the following speeches:

She designed and delivered several series of workshops on Shakespeare for teachers. And regularly offers workshops and masterclasses for professional actors.

Andrea offers both individual coaching and group workshops. This includes codesigning and delivering an applied drama project for the Royal College of Physicians that is now a mandatory part of training of doctors in Ireland.

He is a New Work Associate at the Abbey Theatre where he identifies new writers, fosters working relationships with playwrights, and supports the development and production of new plays at Ireland's national theatre.



DARREN YORKE enjoys a rich interdisciplinary arts practice with a strong focus on improvisational theatre, or "Impro", which he applies to the making and performance of theatre for young audiences. Hailing from Longford, he holds a BA in Drama & Theatre Studies from Trinity College Dublin and is currently an Arts Council funded YPCE Artist in Residence at Marino Institute of Education.

While based in Canada from 2014-2016, Darren was the Education & Outreach Coordinator for The Improv Centre, where he trained extensively and performed with Vancouver TheatreSports[™]. Inspired by Keith Johnstone's pioneering methodology and show formats, Darren established Grand Stretch[®] in 2017 as Ireland's leading member of the International TheatreSports[™] Institute.
